1. Enchanting: (adjective) charming

Synonyms: delightful, dazzling Antonyms: repulsive, offensive

Example sentence: The view of the city from his 10th floor apartment is really enchanting.

2. <u>Uncouth:</u> (adjective) uncivilised Synonyms: uncultured, uncultivated

Antonyms: refined, cultivated

Example sentence: He is uncouth, rude and drunk most of the time.

3. <u>Astute:</u> (adjective) intelligent Synonyms: sharp- witted, brilliant

Antonyms: naïve, ingenuous

Example sentence: He is an astute businessman that is why he is progressing by leaps and bounds.

4. <u>Candid:</u> (adjective) frank

Synonyms: free-spoken, openhearted

Antonyms: reserved, restrained

Example sentence: Hearing the news of his friend's success, his response was remarkably candid.

5. <u>Diabolical:</u> (adjective) baleful

Synonyms: devilish, infernal Antonyms: heavenly, celestial

Example sentence: They gathered around in a conference room working out diabolical plans to prevent her from selling books.



6. <u>Docile:</u> (adjective) submissive

Synonyms: gentle, meek

Antonyms: obstinate, stubborn

Example sentence: The woman we met there was docile and all silent.

7. Doldrums: (noun) depression

Synonyms: gloom, melancholy

Antonyms: glee, joy

Example sentence: The share market has been in the doldrums since last two days.

8. Consensus: (noun) a general agreement

Synonyms: unanimity, agreement Antonyms: discord, disagreement

Example sentence: In general, the learned consensus dubbed the whole business with indifference.

9. Fabricate: (verb) invent something in order to deceive

Synonyms: formulate, fake

Antonyms: ruin, wreck

Example sentence: She was accused of fabricating data.

10. Fatal: (adjective) something causing death

Synonyms: deadly, lethal

Antonyms: helpful, harmless

Example sentence: Her husband died in a fatal accident.
